



Sport Premium Report 2016-17

What is Sport Premium?

It is an allocation of ring-fenced funding for all primary schools from the Government introduced in 2013-14 and continued in subsequent years, to improve the outcomes for sport and PE for all children.

Principles:

At Leven Valley C of E Primary School we aim to improve the quality of PE and sports provision for all children by:

- Providing specialist coaching to develop children’s skills;
- Providing high quality professional development opportunities for school staff;
- Ensuring facilities, equipment and resources are of high quality;
- Providing access and opportunity for all children to take part and compete in tournaments and competitions.

In 2016-17 the allocation was a lump sum of £8000, plus £5 per pupil (Y1-Y6.) This school received £8275.

Sport Premium 2016-17 Spending and Impact:

Item	Cost	Impact
Inter-school events and competitions delivery & organisation	£700	Children took part in inter-school events to widen experiences and enhance competition opportunities
Ski Competition Entry	£8	Children who excel at skiing were given the opportunity to compete and represent the school in local schools competition.
Transport to events and competitions curricular and extra-curricular	£1296	Children were able to attend numerous inter-school and area competitions.
Onside coaching and after-school club	£1140	Specialist sports coach taught all year groups athletics and sports to a high level during the year.
Waterwise swim safety for Year 5 & 6	£625	Three sessions and a challenge event: children learnt to swim in open water safely and experienced a new sport.
Sailing sessions x3 for Y5 & 6	£600	Children learnt a new sport/skills and developed confidence and independence.
Dance coaching for Reception to Year 4	£355	All children took part and developed skills and abilities. The sessions culminated in a performance to parents and the rest of the school.
Cumbria Cricket coaching for Year 3 – 6 for 6 weeks	£396	Children developed skills, both practical and tactical. They went on to compete in a local schools tournament.
Hockey coaching for Year 3 – 6 at Ulverston Leisure Centre	£225	Children developed skills, both practical and tactical. They used their new skills in a cluster tournament.
Athletics coaching for R – Y6 and before school club	£550	Children learnt new skills and used new equipment. They were better trained for the cluster athletics festival
Equipment and resources	£985	Towfloats, football kits, dance leotards, medals and trophy engraving
Supply costs for events and activities	£1100	Enabled events to take place and be staffed accordingly and allowed maximum time for participation.
Dance Platform: coaching and performance for Year 5 & 6 children	£35	All children took part in a dance event, having built skills, knowledge and confidence through taught sessions.
